The What's on Guide is part of 'Working to 2012'. This is Luton's contribution to the four year Cultural Olympiad which began in 2008. In the coming year we will see many events planned for the run up to the London 2012 Olympic games and of course the Olympic Torch visiting the town on Sunday 8th July 2012.

Luton is one of 66 evening celebration sites. The evening events will offer thousands of people the opportunity to come together and get involved in celebrations and share in the Olympic spirit. As part of the events LOCOG and the Presenting Partners, Coca-Cola, Lloyds TSB and Samsung, will stage exciting entertainment shows where a cauldron will be lit from the Olympic Flame, marking the end of the day's proceedings.

To celebrate the Olympic Torch a Festival weekend is being planned for 6th to 8th July. This will include the Carnival, Mela, fringe events and a concert.

Early in 2012 we are expecting the announcement on our bid to become a City. The Love Luton campaign, which drove the City Status bid, is continuing to work both locally and nationally. Over the coming months look out for events which are officially sponsored by Love Luton.
