Who are we?

A day service for adults with a moderate learning disability in Luton, some of whom have physical disabilities, autism, autistic tendencies or other additional health needs.

What we do

We support people to choose and participate in various activities in the community. These activities include gardening, art, craft, music, drama, work skills, volunteer work and communication skills.

We help people to use community facilities, such as colleges, leisure centres, shops, parks, and libraries. There are specialist health staff that support people through physiotherapy, keep fit, art therapy, speech & language therapy and health groups

Referrals can be made to other services if necessary, such as psychiatry, community nursing, behavioural teams or supported employment.

How a service is offered

A referral must be made to the Adult Learning Disability Team. They will do an assessment to decide whether a service can be offered through the Bramingham Centre. If a service can be provided, there will be a trial period, after which the service will be reviewed.

Will I have to pay?

An individual will not have to pay for using the centre. However, there may be payment for the community services and transport that an individual decides to use. A meal can be bought at the centre or an individual could bring in a packed lunch.

Quality

The staff team at the Bramingham Centre will help an individual to find activities and services to meet their needs. The staff will help the individual to make their own personal plan of activities.

Each year the support received by an individual will be reviewed to make sure that the service is of a high standard, following Luton Borough Council policies, procedures and good practice guidelines.

An individual can choose to change their activities at anytime and discuss them with those who support them

If an individual is not happy with the service provided, they have the right to complain. For details of how to complain, ask for a copy of our 'Customer Complaints' leaflet available from the address on this leaflet.
