# LUTON BOROUGH COUNCIL ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, CRIME AND POLICING ACT 2014 (the Act) PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER POWER COURT 

Luton Borough Council, is satisfied that:

- the activities in the restricted area described in this order have had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality;
- the effect or likely effect of the activities is, and, is likely to be, of a persistent or continuing nature;
- the effect of the activities is such as to make those activities unreasonable; and
- the prohibitions imposed in this order are reasonable to prevent the detrimental effect continuing, occurring or recurring.

In the circumstances, it is hereby ordered that:

1. Camping in motor vehicles, trailers, caravans, tents or otherwise is prohibited with immediate effect within the public spaces, including the public highway, situated in and within the vicinity of Power Court, Luton, being the area shown delineated and hatched in red on the map which is hereunto annexed, and which forms part of this order (the restricted area).
2. Parking of camping vehicles including trailer tents, camper vans, caravans and motor homes is strictly prohibited within the restricted area.

If you do anything which is prohibited by this order you may be prosecuted. If you are prosecuted and convicted the maximum penalty is a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (currently $£ 1,000$ );

This order shall remain in force until $20^{\text {th }}$ November 2020.
An interested person, being an individual who lives in the restricted area or who regularly works in or visits that area, may apply to the High Court under section 66 of the Act to challenge the validity of the order. Such application must be made within the period of 6 weeks beginning with the date on which the order was made.

The grounds on which such an application can be made are:

- that the Council did not have power to make the order or to include particular prohibitions imposed by the order; and/or
- that a requirement under Chapter 2 of the Act was not complied with.
