Bail Supervision Programme

Information for Young People



What is Bail Supervision?

The Luton Youth Offending Service Bail Supervision Programme is offered to young people whose offending is so serious and/or so frequent that they would otherwise be remanded into Local Authority Accommodation or into custody. It may also be because you are at risk of being remanded into custody because you have not been keeping to your bail conditions.

You have been placed on the Bail Supervision Programme as a condition of bail.

It is important that you keep all your appointments if you are to continue to keep your freedom. If you are sick you will need a doctor's certificate.

What does Bail Supervision Involve?

An individual programme will be produced outlining what will be required of you and a copy will be given to you.

You will be allocated a Bail Supervision Officer and they will give you appointments to see them at least three times a week. You will be required to sign the programme together with the standards of behaviour that will be expected of you whilst you are subject to the programme.

The officer may also require you to attend other appointments during this time, for example a careers interview. If you need individual help with problems, such as drugs or alcohol misuse, we can arrange for someone to help you.

What happens if you do not keep your Appointments?

A record of attendance will be kept and the court will be informed if you do not keep appointments without good reason. Failing to keep to the requirements of the Bail Supervision Programme is a breach of your bail. The local police may be informed and this may result in your arrest.

If you breach any of your bail conditions, including your Bail Supervision Programme, the court can remand you into custody until your trial and/or sentencing.
