

Starting school September 2024

(for children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020)

We hope that these information slides will assist you with applying for your child's starting school place.

Starting school is an important time for your child so please take the time to read through the information provided.

Take a look at the <u>How to apply for a school place in September 2024</u> guide available via Luton School Admissions webpage at www.luton.gov.uk/admissions.

The guide provides detailed information of the school admissions process and how school places are allocated.

National closing date

National closing date is 15 January 2024

It is vital that all starting school applications are submitted by **Monday 15 January 2024**

Late applications will not be processed until after the offer date



Important things to consider

When deciding on your first, second and third preferences it is important to familiarise yourself with

- 1. The admissions criteria for your preferred schools (see pages 23 to 64 within the How to Apply for school place 2024 guide). It is vital that you understand how places will be allocated if there are more applicants for your preferred schools than places available.
- 2. The admissions process it is important that you understand the admissions process (see pages 11 to 12 within the guide).
- 3. How places have been allocated in previous years (see pages 23 to 64 within the guide).
- 4. Please be aware that the system of processing parental preferences places more emphasis on the schools' admissions criteria and only uses preference ranking where your child qualifies for a place at more than one school (see pages 11 to12 for further details).
- 5. You are strongly advised to name three different schools on your form. Some parents/carers believe that if they only express a preference for one school, or name the same school two or three times, they increase their chance of gaining a place at the school, this is not correct.

If you would like your child to attend your catchment area school you should specify the school as a preference. Where the catchment area school has more applications than places available, those living in the catchment area and not specifying it as a preference will not be considered for a place.

If parents/ carers are unsuccessful in gaining a place at any of their preferred schools, their child will be allocated a place at one of the nearest schools to their home address with vacancies.

Applying for a private school or schools outside of Luton

Luton parents seeking a place at a school(s) outside of Luton must apply through Luton Council.

Where parents specify an out of borough school as their first, second or third preference they must check the following with the individual school

- The school's admissions criteria
- Whether they also need to complete any supplementary forms supplied by the school
- 3. You do not need to apply to Luton for a private school, however we advise you to still complete an application for Luton schools in case of change to circumstances



Applying for catholic schools

Parents wishing to apply for a place at Sacred Heart Primary School or St Joseph's Primary School, must also provide their child's original Baptismal Certificate or Certificate of Reception. The documents must be handed directly to the school's reception by **15 January 2024**.

Parents wishing to apply for a place at St Margaret of Scotland Primary School and/or St Martin de Porres Primary School must also complete the Supplementary Form for St Margaret of Scotland Primary School and St Martin de Porres Primary School and provide their child's original Baptismal Certificate of Reception. The documents must be handed directly to the relevant school's reception by **15 January 2024.**

The supplementary form can be requested at www.luton.gov.uk/admissions. Alternatively, a paper copy can be obtained from the school or from the Council's Admissions Team.

For Catholic Schools outside of Luton, please refer to the individual schools for their application process Further information can be found on pages 42 to 51 within the How to Apply for school place 2024 guide.



Frequently asked questions

- If I apply early, will this guarantee my first preference school? Applications are not processed on a first come first served basis. Places are allocated using the schools admissions criteria which you can find in the How to apply for a school place guide
- If I apply for the same school three times will I stand a better chance? No, you should apply for three different schools.
- We might move house, shall I wait until we move? You must apply at the address you are living at prior to the closing date.
- We have other children attending our preferred school, will this guarantee a place for my child?
 Remember to state on the application if your child has any siblings at the preferred schools. Remember, this does not guarantee a place automatically
- My child has a cousin at the school, do they count as a sibling? No, cousins do not count as siblings



Tips for completing an online application via the parent portal

If you need to register for a new account you will be sent an email and will need to click on the confirmation link

Log in using your email address and password

Follow the steps set out

You can go back into the portal as many times as you like prior to the closing date if you wish to make changes. Preferences can be changed at any time until the closing date

Remember to put information of siblings who will be attending the preferred school at the time your child transfers

Once you are happy with your application, remember to click submit

How to apply online - step 3

Scroll down the page and click on the green 'Go to education portal' button

It is really important that you read our How to apply for a school place for September 2024 guide before making your application.

Making an application using the Education Portal

You must register to the online system if you have not used the online application system in the past two year.

Once you have completed the registration, you will be able to access the system using the log in details you have used this year for any future online applications you wish to make.

You will be asked to upload proof of your address to the online system

You must read the checklist before submitting your application.

The closing date for applications to be considered in the initial allocation is 15 January 2024.

All documents must also be provided by **15 January 2024**. Please note, additional forms must be provided to the relevant council by **15 January 2024**.

If you specify St Margaret of Scotland Primary School and/or St Martin de Porres Primary School as a preference, you must also complete the schools' supplementary form and provide both the completed supplementary form and your child's original Baptismal Certificate direct to the relevant school.

If you specify Sacred Heart Primary School and/or St Josephs Primary School as a preference, you must provide your child's original Baptismal Certificate direct to the relevant school.

The documents must be provided by 15 January 2024.

Applications received after 15 January 2024 will be treated as late. Late applications will be processed in April 2024.

Go to education portal

Please note, the education portal can be used to apply online for an infant/primary school place and to keep up to date with any changes you make to your application.

After the closing date, an update on the school your child has been allocated can be seen on the portal from 16 April 2024.


How to apply online - step 4

Infant class size legislation- (page 65 in the How to Apply for a school place for September 2024 guide)

The law states that class sizes must not exceed 30 pupils in infant classes where the majority of the pupils will reach the age of 5, 6 or 7 during the school year.

This legislation means that local education authorities and governing bodies of schools must comply with limits on infant class sizes. Infant classes are limited to no more than 30 pupils for each qualified teacher in a class.

Where the council has refused admission on the grounds that class size prejudice would occur, an Appeal Panel can only allow an appeal in the three circumstances listed

- 1. The admission arrangements are not lawful and do not meet the requirements of the School Admissions Code and the School Standards and Framework Act 1998. and/or
- 2. The decision to refuse admission was not one which a reasonable admission authority would make in the circumstances of the case. A reasonable decision is one which an admission authority would make taking into account factors such as the admission policy for the school, the internal operation of the school and the school's ability to accommodate pupils and meet the class size limit of 30. or
- 3. Your child would have been offered a place if the admission arrangements had been properly implemented. The Appeal panel will consider whether the admission authority carried out the admission arrangements properly or if the rules were broken. If your child would have been given a place if the rules had been applied properly then an appeal must be allowed.
