

Percentage change in population, 1991 - 2001




- Luton's population has increased by 6.2%, the fifth largest rise in its audit family.
- The increase in population is similar to the East of England figure, at 5.2%, but significantly above the average figure for England and Wales.
- Estimates produced by Bedfordshire County Council and Luton Borough Council predict a slight decline in Luton's population between 2001 and 2011.

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Population Density, persons per hectare 2001




• Luton is clearly the most densely populated of its audit family – some 39.7 persons per hectare above the East of England average and 38 persons per hectare above the least densely populated area, Peterborough.

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% of resident population with no qualifications, 2001




- The percentage of the resident population with no qualifications in Luton mirrors both the national and regional figures.
- Within its audit family, Luton has the fourth lowest percentage of population with no qualifications, 31.3%.

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

Audit Family

- Luton's population remains young, with 23.5% of its resident population being between the ages of 0-15.
- Within the audit family, the percentage 0-15 year olds is only higher in Blackburn with Darwen, at 25.2%.
- The Luton figure is just over 3% higher than the East of England and England and Wales figures, which are almost identical at 20.1% and 20.2% respectively.



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Population aged 75+, percentages, 2001




- Adding further demonstration to the young population of Luton, it is shown that there is a relatively low percentage of 75+ year old in Luton's population.
- At 5.1%, Luton's proportion of over 75s is the second lowest in its audit family, with Milton Keynes slightly lower at 4.8%.

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Long Term Illness, percentages 2001




Audit Family

- The percentage of those with a long term illness in Luton is similar to the East of England average, whilst it is below the England and Wales figure by almost 3 percentage points.
- Within the audit family, Luton has the third lowest percentage of population with a long term illness, 5.3 percentage points below the highest area, Rochdale.

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






• Luton's unemployment level is above the regional and national figures, but is around the average for its audit family.

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Long-term unemployed, percentage of the unemployed classified as long-term unemployed, 2001



- At 28.3%, the percentage of unemployed classified as 'long term' is relatively low within the audit family the 5th lowest figure.
- Although below the East of England average, the percentage for Luton is below the national figure by 2 percentage points.

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
