

THE BOROUGH OF LUTON (RED ROUTE) (NO.1) (EXPERIMENTAL) TRAFFIC ORDER 2018

THE BOROUGH OF LUTON (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND LOADING) (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT NO.RR1) (EXPERIMENTAL) ORDER 2018

NOTICE is hereby given that on 5th November 2018 Luton Borough Council, the Highway Authority for the said Borough, made the above Traffic Orders under the relevant provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended), specifically including section 10 (supplementary provisions as to experimental traffic orders).

The Orders will come into force on 19th November 2018 and will be in force for an experimental period of up to a maximum of 18 months.

The general effect of the Orders will be to experimentally introduce Red Route controls, where the stopping of vehicles is prohibited at any time, in Airport Way (A505) between its junction with Airport Way Roundabout and its junction with London Luton Airport roundabout (A505), including both sides of each of the side roads or vehicle entrances opening into this length of Airport Way, and to suspend any existing waiting or waiting and loading restrictions in those lengths of road whilst the experiment remains in force.

The Council will consider in due course whether the Orders should continue in force indefinitely by means of permanent Orders made under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Anyone wishing to object to the making of permanent Orders should send the grounds of their objection in writing to the undersigned by 19th May 2019 (quoting reference PS022-17) or, if the Orders are subsequently varied by another Order made under section 9 or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, within six months from the coming into operation of that variation or modification (whichever is the latest).

A copy of this Notice and the Orders together with a plan and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Orders may be inspected at the Town Hall during normal office hours by appointment or on the Council's web site: www.luton.gov.uk/parking

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Orders or any provision contained therein on the grounds that they are not within the powers contained in the above Act or any requirement of that Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders are made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
